(at that time in Melville Street). She was the Administrative Officer for SCDA Summer Schools in St Andrews in the 1950s. Her friends in SCDA purchased a trophy to be awarded to the Runners Up in Edinburgh District One Act Play Festivals.

Some years after Mrs Charles Rowland's death this trophy and the Edith Forbes Trophy were changed over and this trophy is now awarded to the Winners of the Festival.
